Note: References must be bound or secured in a three-ring binder with a title page. They may have highlighted text and self-adhesive index tabs or dividers, however they <u>must be permanently attached</u>. No other additions or modifications to the references are allowed. <u>Handwritten notes are NOT permitted</u>. References with loose paper or pages and freestanding tabs (e.g., repositionable sticky notes/tabs of any kind) are not permitted into the testing centers.
